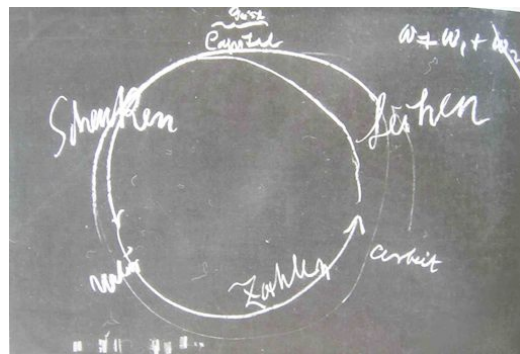

This day will offer an opportunity to explore monetary phenomena in depth including the background to recent events. Rudolf Steiner's idea of three kinds of money will provide a lens with which to observe the financial circumstances of humanity today and how in accounting monetary differentiation is evident.



The content will be primarily participant driven, in the sense that it will focus on individual questions and circumstances as a starting point with which to discover what lies behind current thinking and its manifestation in outer events. The aim of the day is to make sense of finance in such a way that the economic process becomes visible. The content will be illustrated with visual imagery.

Course Tutor: Arthur Edwards is a director of the *Centre for Associative Economics*, teaches financial literacy in schools and at conferences, and co-edits *Associative Economics Monthly*.
